Panorama Achiever Award

The Panorama Achiever is an award that all students at Panorama can achieve! Students choose goals from the form and work towards these goals throughout the entire school year. It is a great way for students to learn valuable life skills and receive recognition for doing so. At the end of the year, students gather signatures from teachers and supervisors, proving their completion of each goal. Students are then recognized in a school wide assembly and their names will be printed on a banner that will hang in the lunchroom. Students will also be given a medal and celebrate with an ice cream party for their hard work. It is a great program that encourages Panorama students to go above and beyond!

Below we have included a brief explanation of some of the requirements. If you have more questions, your child's teacher can provide some clarity. Some of these events have already happened. Make sure to gather signatures for the requirements you have already completed. The deadline to turn in completed forms is Friday, April 21, 2023.

Kindergarten-2nd grade students are required to complete 8 of the goals by the deadline to receive the Panorama Achiever Award. There are over 20 options to choose from.

Read at least 3,500 minutes at home

To pass off this goal, students must submit their reading minutes weekly to their teacher.

Pass of PSF 40+

PSF stands for Phoneme Segmentation Fluency. This goal is available to Kindergarten and first grade students. It shows if students are able to fluently segment words into sounds, which is a critical early literacy skill.

Get Your Letter on the Chicka Chicka Boom Boom Tree

Kindergarten students can get their letter on the Chicka Chicka Boom Boom Tree in the kindergarten hallway when they pass off all of their letters and sounds.

Grade Level Sight Words

See your child's teacher to pass off this goal. Kindergarten students must pass off

75 of the words that were taught throughout the year. First graders must pass off 150 of the words that were taught throughout the year.

Read proficiently (based on Acadience EOY) or makes typical or above typical growth.

The Acadience EOY is a reading test that is given to all students at Panorama in April (End of Year). You can find out your students' results by asking your child's teacher. This requirement shows that students are reading on grade level or making sufficient progress each year.

Pass off addition and subtraction facts to 12

2nd grade students take timed addition and subtraction fact tests each week in class. In order to pass off your facts as a Panorama Achiever you must successfully pass these tests.

Science Fair

The Science Fair will be held in the Spring. All students are eligible to enter.

Attend Literacy Night/Math Night

Literacy Night was held October 6th. Math Night will be held in March. These are family events that are fun and engaging.

Harvest Hop

Harvest Hop is a PTA event held every year in October. Students perform dances for family members.

Reflections Contest

Reflections is a PTA sponsored art contest. Entries are due October 17th. Students can submit artwork in a variety of categories, including 2-D art, 3-D art, photography, dance, literature, music, film, and others. Storytelling Festival

Storytelling Festival is an event that was held on October 6th. Students can recite a nursery rhyme (K-2) or a story (3-5) to an audience.

Art Club

Kindness Club

Kindness Club is held once a month after school. Students work together to do service projects for members of our school community.

Reading Fair

Library Challenge

The library challenge is a 10 book reading challenge. All students can participate from reading picture books to chapter books.. Library Challenge papers are in the library.

Book Club

Book Club is an after school club available to 3rd-5th graders. At the end of the year, there will be one Book Club meeting that 2nd grade students are invited to participate in. Students will read a book on their own and then come to the meeting for a fun activity centered around the book.
